This course, run **online over four mornings**, is the pathway into finance, moving slowly in a carefully structured progression, with plenty of practical exercises each step along the way.

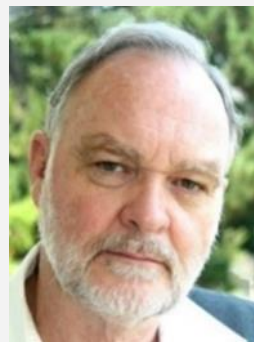
